From the Desk of Laura Owen, Interim CEO . . .

I admire people who write family Christmas letters. My mother has written them for over 50 years and, in an odd, old-fashioned way, I have picked up her tradition of releasing an annual "report" each holiday season. This year, if I find myself with some extra time before Thanksgiving and Christmas, I am sure the theme for our family letter will be, "the year of the move."

This year, our youngest daughter moved into college, my mother moved from her one level bungalow into an apartment in a senior community and our family will have settled into our new home. Collectively, three generations of the family are sharing varied levels of anxiety and joy as we settle into the next chapter of our lives.

Fortunately, my mother and I had nearly three months to prepare for her move. Together, and with the help of our dear Patsy, we went through files, photographs, family keepsakes and "junk." Each item came with a story and each story belonged to my mother, one of "us" and often another someone special. Looking back – it was a beautiful time of retelling our family history.

Not everyone receives the gift or the blessing of sharing in life review. Too often I meet families who have enlisted the help of our agency when their loved one is in his or her final days. So consumed by finding a cure or a specialist to "fight" a terminal diagnosis, they have missed their opportunity to reconnect with each other before earthly goodbyes.

As a hospice employee and end-of-life care advocate, I carry the hope that each of us will have the shared experience of a resolved passing. Where our experience in losing someone we love, there is time for forgiveness and understanding. Where one finds peace in the acceptance of his or her mortality – including the limitations of our physical selves. I also wish that each of us has the opportunity to be our "best selves" throughout our final days.

Dr. Cecily Saunders, a leader in the modern day hospice movement shared, "You matter because you are you. You matter to the last moment of your life, and we (hospice) will do all we can not only to help you die peacefully, but also to live until you die." This year, Hospice of Davidson County has already provided end-of-life care for over 300 patients and their families - many of them in our county's only inpatient unit, The Henry Etta and Bruce Hinkle Hospice House. It is our agency's hope that their experience provided the clinical, social, spiritual, and volunteer and bereavement support needed to find hope and resolve in their loss.

Although mother and I are not faced with a terminal illness, in preparing for her move I was fortunate to be the recipient of little known family stories, facts from her immigrant heritage and treasured mementos. In effect, we shared in a "life review" of her footprint on earth among family and her community of friends. Thanks Mom – and welcome to your new home!

We are, believe it or not, in our third year of operation at The Hinkle Hospice House and last year we celebrated our 25th anniversary as a hospice organization. We have made great strides in becoming the best hospice organization giving our patients the best end-of-life care and support to their families and friends.

As you know, we are searching for a new Chief Executive Officer. We have an Executive Search Committee dedicated to finding the best person to lead and direct this organization. 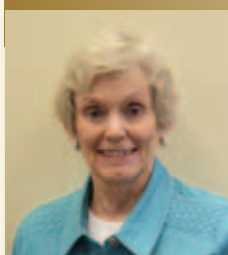
Welcome New Board Members

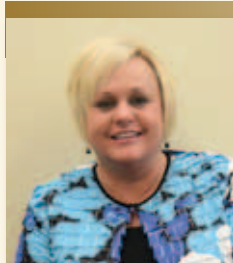
ROCHELLE BOBO

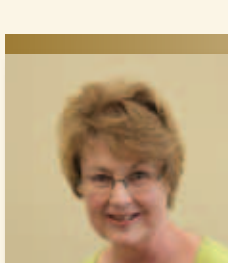
SALLY LANG

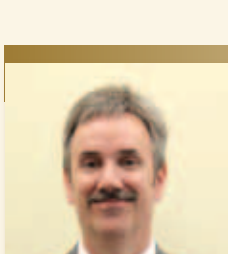
SUSAN TERRELL

Volunteer Spotlight: "Honey, it's Thursday" . . .



Volunteer Susan Whitesides reminds her husband as he inquires about her plans for the day, "Honey, its Thursday." Charlie instantly remembers that Susan volunteers at Hospice of Davidson County every Thursday. Susan joined the HODC volunteer family in February of 2009 and remains committed to sharing her time and talents with our organization. The better part of her Thursdays are spent at the Hinkle Hospice House greeting visitors, answering phones, stocking linens and visiting with patients. She also provides Supportive Care calls to Home Care patients and families.

Susan enjoyed an impressive forty year nursing career in hospital and home care settings as well as in public health care. Susan still maintains her RN licensure and shares that, "Being at the Hinkle Hospice House is an opportunity to continue to be around nurses and to be part of a niche that was part of my life for so many years." In her twenties, Susan worked as a home care nurse in a county without a hospice. Susan comments, "I didn't do a good job dealing with death and thought with a second chance I might do better with it. Through a long nursing career and life experiences I am certainly more comfortable dealing with death now - it is a part of life."

Susan was inspired to become a Hospice of DC volunteer through a personal hospice experience with her mother who spent her final six days in a hospice home. Susan shared that while the care there was good; there were things that could be better. "Families need to feel comforted and treated with compassion as well as have the opportunity for communication with the care team. Families need to know what to expect." Susan makes every effort to ensure that families feel comfortable and that they are greeted courteously and compassionately. From a clinical perspective, Susan commented, "The Hinkle Hospice House does a really good job with this." Susan also shared that, "through my own observations and comments heard from patients and families both in Home Care and at the Hospice House, Hospice of DC's quality of care is excellent."

Why does she continue to give of herself and her time? "Being here is the highlight of my week. I look forward to the friendships that I've developed among staff and other volunteers. Most of all, I enjoy spending time with patients, getting them out of their rooms to go for a stroll and view the scenery. There is no better way to feel good than to do something for someone else."

Parting words of wisdom, "I would encourage families to talk with their physicians about hospice. From a nursing standpoint, families could often have access to hospice services and care months before they actually do. I have seen firsthand the difference hospice makes."

I'd like to share how Hospice of DC is embracing this new position and enhancing our community bereavement programs.

Hospice of DC's commitment to serving the bereaved extends into the community in a dynamic fashion.

Over the past several months our offices have been focused on developing new programming to meet the unique needs of our bereaved. All of our bereavement staff have taken a close examination of our caseloads and learned that mealtime can be especially difficult for those who have lost their life companion. In addition, the weekends prove to be a dreaded time for those whose caregiving roles and twosome plans have ceased. It's been a joy getting to know new faces and needs in individual counseling sessions. I have had the pleasure of aiding individuals ages three to ninety and been excited by the challenge of tailoring individual counseling sessions to match a variety of interests, talents and personalities.
